By providing quality education, skill-based education and vocational training to the youth, the college aims at fostering economic growth in the region. Besides enhancing its students' chances at employability, the college works with a mission of inducing inclusive social growth which entails aspects like making proper health care, women's empowerment, environmental sustainability and good governance achievable in North Guwahati and its adjacent areas. Not only does the college steer its students towards obtaining academic and professional degrees, but also stresses on all round development of students — physical, intellectual, moral and spiritual development.

he education system has undergone massive revamping in the recent times, concentrating more on learner-centric education. To keep pace with the changing times, North Gauhati College envisages making education inclusive and dynamic in such a way that it caters to the diverse needs of the learners. It is the vision of the college to facilitate all-round development of the students. In order to do so, the college places adequate focus not only on academic pursuits, but also on co-curricular activities and skill development.

A BRIEF HISTORY...



orth Guwahati is situated on the northern bank of the river Brahmaputra, just opposite to the city of Guwahati. This ancient capital town of ancient rulers of Kamrup also enjoys the privilege of being the birth place of some erudite scholars of Assam like Anundoram Barooah, Karmabeer Nabin Chandra Bordoloi, Bolinarayan Borah, Col. Shivram Borah, Lakshiram Baruah and many others. Also known as the 'Temple Town' of Assam, it houses important sites of pilgrimage such as Ashwaklanta, Dirgheswari, Manikarneswar, Rudreswar Devalaya, Doul Govinda Mandir, Auniati Satra etc.

4th September, 1962 was an important date in the history of North Guwahati. The day saw the establishment of North Gauhati College, the first and only institution of Higher Education catering to greater North Kamrup (Old Kamrup District). A group of young educated youths under the leadership of Sri Manindra Kumar Barooah gave shape to the initiative of establishing a College in the locality. Amidst the applause of a jubilant crowd, the inaugural function was held at the premises of AKI, North Guwahati on 4^a September, 1962, which was graced by the presence of Sri Devkanta Barooah, the then Education Minister, Assam.



Sri Kokil Bezbaruah headed the institution as the first Principal In-Charge of North Gauhati College, mentoring student strength of only 35. Prior to joining North Gauhati College, Sri Bezbaruah was working in the History Department, Pragjyotish College. On 4th of September, 1963 North Gauhati College celebrated its 1st Freshmen Social, and the meeting was presided over by the then Vice Chancellor of Gauhati University, Dr. H.J. Taylor. Following this, on 24th of November, 1963 Sri Devkanta Barooah laid the foundation stone of the College in the present location.

Sheer hard work of a group of young educated youth, love and faith of the people, along with the donations received from the people led to the well being and prosperity of the institution. Eminent persons like Sri Suresh Rajkhowa and Dr. Heramba Kanta Borpujari inspected the College and expressed satisfaction on the growth rate of the newly established College. In 1965, Sri Manindra Kr. Barooah took over the charge as Principal from Sri Kokil Bezbaruah. He was followed by Sri Bhaba Kanta Sarma, Sri Dhirendra Nath Kalita, Dr. Bhrigu Mohan Goswami, Hasmat Ali, Dr. Sarbananda Das and Dr. Sandhya Das, who discharged their duties successfully as principals of the College.

The Science stream was introduced on 20th August, 1979 and special initiative was taken by Sri Lakshyadhar Choudhury, who was then the Education Minister of the state. At present the college possesses a very active NCC wing which has brought accolades to the Institution. The wing started way back in 1964 with Sri Dhirendra Nath Kalita as the Officer In-charge. The NSS wing started functioning from the year 1977. In 1980 the women's wing of NCC was introduced, and Dr. Sandhya Das was appointed the 1st Officer In-charge.

Students have also brought laurels to the College in the field of sports and culture. Besides these achievements, the College has successfully held UGC sponsored national seminars where many internationally acclaimed eminent scholars deliberated.

Buses and four wheelers (both private and public transportation) ply via Amingaon and Gauripur routes to North Guwahati. Water transport like ferry and bhutbhuti (engine boat) commute regularly from 6 am to 8 pm, connecting Guwahati to North Guwahati.

After taking up charge as the Principal of North Gauhati College on 13-01-2012, preparations for the celebration of Golden Jubilee started, and the events concluded successfully in the month of January, 2013. At the initial stage of my tenure, some major infrastructural developmental schemes were under consideration either for new construction or repairing. Amongst these schemes were the New Academic Building, Social Science Building, Science Building, Administrative Schools, Entrance Gate, Library building, Auditorium, Girls' Common Room, Drinking Water Project, Indoor Stadium, Playground, Women's Hostel, Campus Wall etc. Over the period of my tenure, some of these infrastructural schemes have been successfully implemented, and have come up after suitable mobilisation of available funds.

Higher Education today faces many challenges, and the college has geared itself up to face such challenges. I would, therefore, like to call upon my colleagues, students and also the guardians to come forward and work as a team for the welfare of the institution. With this, I welcome the newcomers to this college and hope that their sincere efforts will bring laurels to the college in the days to come.

4. VOCATIONAL COURSES:

North Gauhati College has been offering three year (six semesters) Bachelor Degree Course in Vocational Studies (B.Voc.) since 2015 in collaboration with the National Skills Development Council (NSDC). The courses offered are –

- (i) Tourism and Hospitality Management
- (ii) Beauty Therapy and Aesthetics (It may be mentioned herein that North Gauhati College is the only college under G.U. to offer this course).

The B.Voc Degree is recognised by UGC and is affiliated to Gauhati University. A special feature of the course is that there are multiple exit points, which facilitates a student to leave the course at the end of the first year with a Diploma. Similarly, if someone leaves after two years s/he will get an Advance Diploma and those who complete three years will get the B.Voc Degree. The course has earned wide popularity among students in view of the fact that the central and the state government have laid much emphasis on skills development in their recent policies.

The college has a separate campus for B. Voc. with well equipped class rooms, lab facility for Beauty Therapy and a computer lab.

The placement records of students pursuing this course have been quite satisfactory. Though the first batch is yet to complete the three year course, three students have already been absorbed by Hotels and Trade Agencies as the students have availed of the opportunity of multiple exits. It may be mentioned that Radisson Blu, a five star hotel, has recruited one of the students in the position of a Staff Member.

The departments have trained and qualified faculty members appointed both on regular and part time basis. Tourism and Hospitality department has Radisson Blu, Shivani Aviates, GNRC as industry partners and Beauty Therapy department is in partnership with Imagic Beauty Clinic and Training Institute, Guwahati.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

The Academic session starts in accordance with the directions received from H.S. Council and the Gauhati University. All form fill-ups will be done only in online mode and applications for admission will be available in the college website from June 02, 2018. The important dates regarding the submission, interview/admission are mentioned in the prospectus, college website and in leading local newspapers. Admissions will be strictly on the basis of merit, and is governed by the rules framed by the college authority. The decisions of the Admission Committee regarding admission are final. Any pressure or interference from any quarter for admission of a particular student will result in forfeiture of the claim. All admissions are provisional and subject to the approval of the AHSEC/G.U. The college will not be responsible if AHSEC/GU does not approve of the admission of any student on the ground of lack of migration certificate, eligibility criteria, or for furnishing wrong or false documents. Candidates are required to produce ORIGINAL documents along with one set of Photostat copy at the time of interview. The list of required documents is given below:

- A) Mark sheet of the last qualifying examination
- B) Age certificate
- C) Character certificate
- D) Provisional pass certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended
- E) Caste certificate (if applicable)

Students who have passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year will have to submit a Gap Certificate from the Head of the institution last attended or a Gazetted officer testifying his/her activities during the interim period.

Students will be offered the priviledge of free admission by the college following the recent norms and directions set by the government.

Reservation:

There is provision for reservation of seats for students belonging to SC, ST, OBC, MOBC and Specially-abled categories as per State Government Rules. Students of such categories will have to produce certificate from the competent authority. 10 seats are reserved for students having records of outstanding performance in the extracurricular activities like sports, culture, NCC and others both in H.S 1st year and TDC 1st Semester respectively. Employee quota provision is also applicable for admission. Requisite documents have to be submitted by the students along with the application form.

GENERAL RULES:

Great emphasis is laid on discipline and character building. Students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline. There is a Discipline Committee to look into such matters. The students admitted to the college must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authority. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory progress in academics, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of college dues, showing discourtesy to the teacher's and the staff in any forms adoption of unfair means during examination etc. are some of the offences which may lead to termination of scholarships and even expulsion from the college. Any form of ragging in the college



campus is strictly prohibited. Strong disciplinary action as mentioned above may be taken if anyone is found to be involved directly or indirectly in ragging. The courses of study in the College are full time courses. No students can take any other full time course simultaneously in and outside the institution. Students' societies and associations shall have to abide by the rules and regulations prescribed by the college administration. Only those societies and associations recognized by the Head of the Institution shall have the facilities of the college premises. Any notice desired to be circulated by the students anywhere in the college will need the prior approval of the college authority. Power of maintaining discipline is vested on a Discipline Committee constituted by the Principal of the college. The decision of the Committee shall be final in all matters. Tobacco, alcohol and any other kind of substance abuse in any form is prohibited in the campus. Wearing of uniform and carrying of the identity card in the college campus by the students is mandatory.

Examination Rules:

The Examination Cell of the college conducts all examinations. The cell follows the guidelines received from Gauhati University for Undergraduate courses and Assam Higher Secondary Education Council for Higher Secondary courses. It strictly adheres to college examination and promotion rules.

Orientation Programme:

The Head of the Institution addresses the students in the Orientation Programme held on the first day of the academic calendar. The departments also hold briefing sessions with their Major students to acquaint them to the subject and to the Department as a whole.

Selection Procedure for Major courses:

Selection of the students for Major Course is done completely on the basis of merit. A student should write the name of the subject [s]he intends to opt for as Major and General course in the Admission Form, selecting from the combinations given in the Prospectus. The student who opts for Major course has to mention three subjects on the basis of preference and name three subjects which [s]he wishes to opt as general subjects in accordance to her/ his preference. Admission in Major Course will be given on the same day of the general admission after conducting a scrutiny by the concerned departments on the basis of merit.


For Boys: Trouser & Shirt (Formal), of prescribed colour. Low waist pants, jeans trousers and short shirts with different colours are not allowed

- * Identity Card: Identity cards will be provided by the college. It is mandatory for students to carry their Identity Cards to college and while participating in any programme outside on behalf of the college. Identity cards must be properly signed by the principal.
- * Attendance: 75% attendance in all subjects is compulsory for students to appear in final examinations. The students must submit their percentage of attendance at office during the time of filling up of their Examination forms. They are to collect their percentage of attendance from their respective Departments, duly signed by the HOD.
- * Use of Mobile: Use of mobile phones in the classroom is strictly prohibited.
- * Substance abuse: Strict action will be taken against a student if [s]he is found smoking, drinking alcoholic beverages, chewing tobacco or indulging in any kind of substance abuse within the college campus.
- * Ragging and Anti-Social Activities: Any form of ragging in the college campus is strictly prohibited. Strong disciplinary action will be taken if anyone is found to be involved directly or indirectly in ragging and in any other kind of ant-social activities.
- Cleanliness: Students are expected to cooperate in keeping the classrooms and campus of the college clean. Dustbins for bio-degradable wastes and non bio-degradable wastes are provided for maintaining the cleanliness in the institution.

LIBRARY

he North Gauhati College Library is rapidly growing up to be one of the leading regional level academic libraries in the north bank of Brahmaputra. The library was established way back in 1962. There are separate reading rooms for students and teachers. The documents in the library are well arranged. The library is well equipped with a good number of text books, reference materials, xerox facilities, internet with fully open access facilities automated with the help of library oriented software SOUL 2.08 (software for university library) network version. All bibliographic details of books, journals and CDROM databases are accessible through the computer. It has a good number of journals (National and International) and magazines. Besides these, the different national and local newspapers (daily and weekly) are available to the user community. North Gauhati College library adequately caters to the needs of the students and teaching community. It provides a conducive environment for intellectual enquiry by providing user focused services to obtain and access scholarly information and knowledge. The library remains open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m on all working days. It offers essential and specialized information, resources and services to meet the growing information needs by-

- Developing user based resources
- Organizing information resources
- Providing human and technology moderated access to information
- Facilitating users to identify, locate, obtain and access information

Every department has its own library where sufficient numbers of books related to the courses of study are available.

Services

The main service in the college library is book lending. The books and journals are purchased as per the requirement of the students and teachers. Basically the following services are provided to the users of the North Gauhati College Library –

he Department of Anthropology, North Gauhati College was started in the year 1972 under the affiliation of Gauhati University. It started with two years PU Course and was upgraded to Degree level from session 1978-79. The Major Course was opened in the vear 1994. Now it offers three courses viz. BA/BSc Major Course, BA/BSc. General Course and Higher Secondary Course (Arts and Science). The department produced the Best Graduate of Arts of Gauhati University in 1999 which was achieved by Minakshi Sarmah. In HS Examination 2002, Dipannita Bhattacharya secured the state highest marks in Anthropology. The department is well equipped with Physical Anthropological and Prehistoric Laboratory and an Ethnographic Museum. The wall magazine of the department Nripatrika ventures to capture the stories and life style of the tribes settled in and around North East India.

BIOTECH-HUB

here is an institutional Biotech Hub (IBH) in the department of Zoology. The hub has been sponsored by the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Govt. of India in its scheme of Establishment of Institutional Level Biotech Hubs by DBT under special programme for North Eastern States of

India. ADD ON FACILITIES

- Canteen: The College has a canteen within the campus for the refreshment of the teaching, non teaching staff, and students of the college. The College Canteen Management Committee looks after concerns like maintenance of the canteen, quality of food etc. The canteen remains open during working hours.
- **Hostel**: A Girls' hostel has been constructed in the college campus, with the financial assistance of UGC. It has been functional since August 2015. The accommodation capacity of the hostel is 24. Students have to fill up separate admission form in order to apply for hostel seat.
- Auditorium: Swahid Dhanbar Das Auditorium, North Gauhati College is equipped with all the necessary amenities and facilities. Besides holding programmes and functions of the college, the auditorium is also at times used by the public for hosting programmes beneficial for the community.
- Play ground: The College has a big well maintained playground, where football and cricket matches are held regularly. There is a Community Stage in the playground, where besides the college the



nearby community also holds functions and other activities. Moreover, an indoor stadium is also under construction. Inter College Volleyball competition in memory of late Ratnajyoti Sarma is hosted by the college every year.

- Automatic Weather Station: The College has installed an Automatic Weather Station (AWS) sponsored by Assam Science Technology and Environment Council (ASTEC). Students, teachers, researcher, officials and general public can access data related to climate and weather of this locality through this station.

years of free education with all facilities.

- Yoga Cell: Yoga cell was established in August 2014 with members from both the students and teaching faculty of the college. The main objective of the cell is to make students and people of the area aware of the importance of Yoga not only as a man-making, nation-building instrument but also as a tool for international peace, harmony and unity. The cell organizes training programmes on Yoga, Pranayama, Meditation as well as lectures and popular talks.
